### MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE FARGO PARK DISTRICT OF DECEMBER 14, 2021

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Park District of the City of Fargo was held on Tuesday, December 14, 2021, at 5:30 p.m. at the Fargo Park District office at 701 Main Avenue, Fargo, North Dakota and via Microsoft Teams. Present at the meeting in person were Commissioners Jerry Rostad, Vicki Dawson, Dawn Morgan, and Joe Deutsch. Also present were: Dave Leker, Broc Lietz, Carolyn Boutain, Brian Arett, Dave Bietz, Kevin Boe, and attorney Jeff Gunkelman.

#### **Approval of Consent Agenda**

Commissioner Jerry Rostad moved and Commissioner Joe Deutsch seconded a motion to approve the following actions on the consent agenda:

(a) The minutes from Minutes from the November 9, 2021 meeting;

### **Recognition of Audience**

Multiple individuals addressed the Board regarding experimental herd reduction in the Park District parks.

#### **Director's Report**

Dave Leker presented to the Board on this matter. It was noted that the Park District opened bids for the Fargo Sports Complex in early December and that McGough is working on confirming all bids. It was noted that the Gross Maximum Price would be established at the January 11, 2022 meeting. It was noted that the comprehensive strategic planning for Park District is starting to kick off and will be about a four month process. It was noted that the Park District has been in contact with the Fargo Moorhead Community Theater regarding their building at Island Park and plans for the future.

Carolyn Boutain presented to the Board regarding Island Park Master Planning. It was noted that the master planner has been in communication with 14 organizations as well has local neighborhoods as part of the planning. There was also a discussion on Island Park Pool and updates on that planning.

#### **Foundation Director's Report**

Brian Arett presented to the Board on this matter. It was noted that staff has been working toward revising the fundraising campaign for the Fargo Sports Complex. It was noted that the Park District has rolled out a public capital campaign.

### FM Sertoma Club Presentation

Darrel Vasvick presented to the Board. It was noted that the Holiday Lights Parade started twenty three years ago with about 10,0000 vehicles passing through Lindenwood. It was noted that in 2020, there were 100 displays with 16,000 cars going through the Park. It was noted that the Club is working with Xcel Energy and JDP Electric to get power running through the park better.

No action was taken on this matter.

#### Approval and Award Bid for Rose Creek HVAC Project

Dave Bietz presented to the Board on this matter. It was noted that the Park District received three bids. It was noted that the winning bid came in \$7,500.00 over budget but that the Park District has the funds to make up for the overage. It was noted that the energy savings will be approximately \$1700/month and that new units generally last between 25 and 35 years.

Commissioner Jerry Rostad moved and Commissioner Joe Deutsch seconded the motion to approve the bid to Robert Gibb & Sons for the Rose Creek HVAC project for a bid amount of \$232,500.00 as presented to the Board. Upon call of the roll, the motion passed unanimously.

#### **Approve Resolution for Land Swap for Fargo Sports Complex**

Dave Leker presented to the Board on this matter. It was noted that the Board approved the Land Swap for the Fargo Sports Complex as part of the Developers Agreement. It was noted that both parcels were appraised at the time of the Developers Agreement. It was noted that the Resolution is a formality to formally exchange the parcels of land. Commissioner Dawn Morgan moved and Commissioner Jerry Rostad seconded a motion to approve the Resolution for the Land Swap for the Fargo Sports Complex as presented to the Board. Upon call of the roll, the motion passed unanimously.

At the conclusion of the above agenda items, a motion to adjourn was made and seconded, and upon unanimous consent the meeting adjourned at approximately 6:45 p.m.

At the November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2021, board meeting, the Fargo Park Board passed a motion to approve "the capital projects funding model as presented and authorize administration to work with the construction manager to solicit bids for the Fargo Sports Complex." Total project cost was set at \$78.6 million dollars in the funding model.

Since the November board meeting, McGough Construction solicited and received bids back regarding the Fargo Sports Complex. McGough split the total project into 34 bid packages and received back 95 bids from subcontractors. Bid prices came back favorable and below base estimates.

At the December 29, 2021, Facilities Committee meeting, the administration presented a gross maximum price (GMP) for the project, recommended alternates, and owner soft costs for at total project cost of \$77,659,657. The breakdown of these costs are listed below:

Construction Cost (CMAR GMP)	\$ 68,218,068.00
Recommended Alternates	\$ 564,569.00
Owner Soft Costs (fees, FF&E)	<u>\$ 8,877,020.00</u>
Total Construction and Soft Cost	\$ 77,659,657.00

RE: Agenda Item No. 7 – Board to consider approval to solicit for bids for Osgood Sloughing Repair Project

In alignment with our Procurement Policy, Policy No. 390, we are requesting permission to publicly bid the Osgood Sloughing Repair Project. Funds for this project are budgeted in 2022. The Park District requested Northern Technologies, LLC, (NTI) to conduct an analysis of likely stability of existing irrigation pond embankments. The purpose of this analysis was to assess likely depth of existing shear surface causing faulting of present construction, and subsequent estimate of corrective grading necessary to achieve stable profile of earthen embankment to facilitate long term play at Osgood Golf Course. NTI concludes that the present embankments are unstable based on their estimate of stability and per observation of failed ground. Further stating, such unstable locations may be corrected with implementation of recommendations as presented in their report. The projected timeline of the project will be as follows:

•	Public Bid Opening:	February 16, 2022, at 1PM
٠	Possible award by Park Board of Commissioners:	March 8, 2022
٠	Start of Construction:	Fall 2022
٠	Project Completion:	Fall/Winter 2022 or Spring 2023

It was recommended at the December 29, 2021, Facilities Committee Meeting to bring this to the full board on the Agenda for consideration and approval.
